DRESS CODE AND GOLF ETIQUETTE

DRESS CODE

General

The following dress code shall apply to all members, tournament participants and non-member guests in KGC :

- a. Track suits, round neck shirt, round neck T-shirts, sweat pants, Jogging pants, cutoffs or beachwear, sandal, chappol, sleeper without back strap, cleats, raised heels or hard spikes and Jeans are not acceptable.
- b. Footwear that damages the course are not permitted on the golf course or on the practice areas.
- c. In Kurmitola Golf Club course hard/iron spikes will not be permitted under any circumstances.
- d. Golf headdress, including hats, visors and headbands are permitted in the clubhouse. Golfers are requested to remove their headdress in the dining room.

DRESS IN THE GOLF COURSE

Dress for Men

- a. Sports/golf shirts with collar and sleeves (short/long) or turtleneck shirts may be worn.
- b. Shirts must be tucked in at the waist with trousers/shorts with belt.
- c. Shorts should be below knee length and must be worn with socks. Long trousers/ walking type shorts below knee may be worn.

Dress for Ladies

- a. Golf shirts, tailored slacks, turtleneck blouses/sweater, long trousers or shorts with belt/skirts at knee length are permitted.
- b. Sleeveless shirts, blouses and other dresses must have collar.

Shoes

- a. Participants must put on proper golf shoes with soft spikes. Golf shoes with iron spikes and PT or Jogging shoes are not allowed.

Head Dress

- a. Golf head dress, including hats, visors and headbands are permitted in the clubhouse. Golfers are requested to remove their headdress in the dining room.

DRESS IN THE RESTAURANT

Dress for Men

- a. Decent casual dress with long trouser and shirt (preferably full sleeves at night) tucked-in at the waist.
- b. Jeans or slippers without back strap are not allowed.
- c. **Shirts printed with offensive, indecent, racial language or symbols are not allowed.**

Dress for Ladies

- a. Ladies may wear casual dress like saree, salwar and Kamiz etc.
- b. Golfers after a round of golf are allowed to use the restaurant facilities in golf dress.
- c. However, golfers are requested to remove their headdress in the dining room.

DRESS DURING INAUGURATION AND PRIZE DISTRIBUTION CEREMONY

Dress for Men

- a. **Day time:** Participants attending inauguration and prize distribution ceremony must put on golf attire in a dry condition. **Sandal or slippers are not allowed.**
- b. **Night:** During winter lounge suit /combination to be worn. During summer informal dress/smart casual with full sleeve shirts tucked in at the waist along with shoes. Ladies may wear formal evening dress or their national dress.

DRESS IN SWIMMING POOL

- a. Swimming trunks or costumes are must for all pool users. Swimming cap and goggles may be worn.
- b. Ladies are to use swimming cap while in the swimming pool.
- c. It is mandatory to have shower before entering the pool.
- d. Anybody with skin rashes, or any kind of infectious disease are forbidden from using the swimming pool.
- e. **Pajama, trouser, or saree are not allowed in swimming pool.**

GOLF ETIQUETTE

Consideration for Other Players

- a. Players should always show consideration for other players on the course and should not disturb their play by moving, talking or making unnecessary noise.
- b. Players should ensure that any electronic device taken onto the course does not distract other players.

Safety

- a. Players should not play until the players in front are out of range.
- b. Players should always alert green staff nearby or ahead when they are about to make stroke that might endanger them.
- c. If a player plays a ball in a direction where there is a danger of hitting someone, he should immediately shout a warning "Fore".

On the Teeing Ground

- a. On the teeing ground, a player should not tee his ball until it is his turn to play.
- b. Players should not stand too close or directly behind the ball, or directly behind the hole when a player is about to play.

On the Putting Green

- a. On the putting green players should not stand on another player's line of putt or, when he is making a stroke cast and shadow on his line of putt.
- b. Players should remain on or close to putting green until all other players in the group have holed out.

Be Ready to Play

- a. Players should be ready to play as soon as it is their turn to play.
- b. When the play of a hole is completed, players should immediately leave the putting green.

Care of the Course

- a. Before, leaving a bunker, players should fill up and smooth holes and footprint made by them and any nearby made by others.
- b. Players should carefully repair any divot hole made by them and any damage on the putting green
- c. Players should avoid causing damage to the course by removing divots when taking practice swing.
- d. Players should ensure that no damage is done to the putting green when putting down the bag and flagstick.
